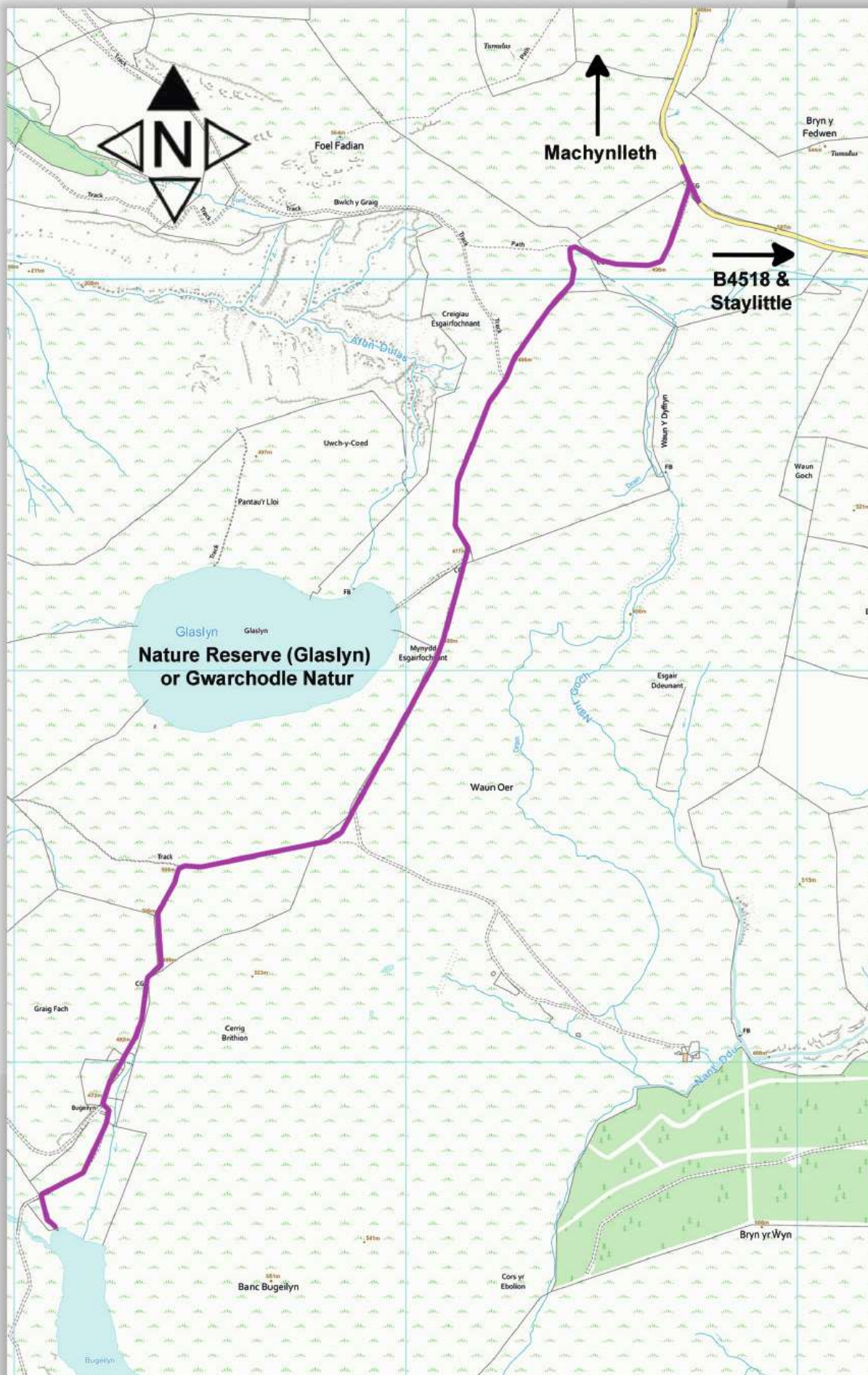


# Llyn Bugeilyn 4 Sporting Season Tickets

## **General Information**

If you're looking for one of those remote, wild upland lakes in breath-taking surroundings we've all read about you've found it. Llyn Bugeilyn is situated in isolated (and we do mean isolated), moorland about 1,700 feet above sea level. Track access leads to the old boat house, a useful shelter in foul weather, from there you can only proceed on foot around the lake. Fishing includes the adjoining, via a man-made canal, Llyn Cwm-Bwr. If you have any queries please do not hesitate to contact our Game Fisheries Officer Karl Humphries.

## **Known Species**

Famed for its unique hard fighting Black Fin Trout, its 45 acres can often produce catches of 10 to 20 of these Brownies per day, up to and around the 1lb mark.

## **Special Conditions**

The season starts on 1st April and closes 30th September. Fishing is only allowed from the bank and is fly only. All fish are to be returned.

There is no path as such around the lake and the ground can be very uneven and boggy in places. Be advised that you should treat fishing this location with the same respect as being in other remote upland areas and take the necessary precautions. The coordinates for the boat house on the lake shore is: 52.518254, -3.738817. Always check the local weather forecast before you set off. The lake is situated in a bowl it is not always possible to see inclement weather approaching. Tell someone where you are going and get back at the agreed time no matter how good the fishing!

## **Access and Parking**

As it can be quite difficult to find you would be best taking directions from Google Maps, after searching for Llyn Bugeilyn. Don't use the postcode to get there as it covers about a six-mile radius.

Llyn Bugeilyn is approximately 8 miles from Machynlleth and 11 miles from Llanidloes via a narrow mountain road, then a 2.2mile track. The track has deteriorated in the past couple of years and is currently accessible only by 4x4 vehicles. There is a combination lock on the gate from the road. The combination is:02383. Once on the track the first lake you'll come to on your right is Glaslyn, a Nature Reserve, carry on until you reach a derelict farm house where the track forks. To the left is Llyn Bugeilyn. Right will take you to the dam head of Lyn Cwm-Bwr where there is some parking. For Llyn Bugeilyn park near the boat house without blocking access.

The grid reference for where the track leaves the mountain road is: 52.518342, -3.738932 (What3Words pins.lamenting.carrots)
